

George Street South Pedestrianisation Project, Sydney



PROJECT UPDATE – NOVEMBER 2021

Works completed

- Mid-block areas are open for pedestrians between Bathurst Street and Goulburn Street on both east and west sides, allowing for free movement across rail tracks mid-block and automated pedestrian signals near intersections. Pavements have also been cleaned and sealed, and furniture installed in this section.
- Paving and seat installation works between Goulburn Street and Hay Street on the east side is largely complete. Barriers on the existing footpath have been removed and area opened for public use.

Current and upcoming works for November

- Traffic signal upgrade works at intersections along George Street at Bathurst Street, Liverpool Street and Goulburn Street.
- Pits, paving and furniture installation between Hay Street and Rawson Place on the east side.
- Continuing works between Goulburn Street and Ultimo Road on the west side, including stormwater, concreting, pit installation and paving.
- Upcoming continuous weekend works in line with a programmed Light Rail shutdown – 27th to 29th November 2021. A separate note will be distributed detailing these works.

Working hours

- Day works: Monday to Saturday 7am to 5pm.
- Night works: Some night works may be required. Separate notifications will be distributed.

We will take steps to minimise impacts on local business owners and residents, however please note there may be machinery noise as well as temporary disruptions to local and pedestrian traffic. Access to all properties will be maintained at all times.
